Plagiarism is:

1. The act of passing off someone else's work as your own

4. Extensive assistance from other people on a paper.
5. Using sections of someone else's homework assignment.
6. Looking at another student's examination during a testing situation.
7. Conferring with fellow students during an examination period.
8. Allowing another student to copy from your examination.
9. Copying portions of sentences from a text and only referencing the author at the end of the paragraph or paper.
10. Having someone else write your paper.
11. Using another person's ideas without acknowledging that person.
12. Allowing another student to copy sections of your paper.
13. Signing another student's name on an attendance sheet.
14. Permitting another student to sign your name on an attendance sheet.
15. An act that can result in expulsion from the University.
