This degree prepares students to operate surveying equipment and provides them with a comprehension of legal surveying principles and state laws regarding surveying and mapping. It also acquaints students with advanced boundary and survey adjustments and with Global Positioning Systems applications. Students are prepared for employment with civil engineering and surveying firms or they may continue their studies to complete the BAS degree in Land Surveying.

- Analyze problem solving of raw and computed data as related to surveying.
- Operate surveying field equipment properly.
- Interpret surveying data used within construction application.
