	c. Grading policy stated clearly (in syllabus) and clear descriptions on assessment and assignment expectations	
	d. Gradebook set up correctly for points or percentage/weights and aligns with

	a. Purpose of materials explained, current, and appropriately cited	
	b. Variety of instructional materials used: readings, lectures, PP, video and websites	
5. Course Activities and Learner Engagement		
	a. Activities lend to learner achieving outcomes	
	b. Activities provide for interaction that support active learning (learner-instructor, learner-content, learner-learner)	
	c. Instructor response time for feedback is stated	
	d. Learner requirements for activities clearly stated	
	e. There is an interactive element in all of the weeks (or most all)

	a. Technology supports learner engagement and activity	
	b. Technologies are readily attainable, current, and a link to privacy policies, where appropriate	
7. Learner Support Accessibility		
	a. Course links to college technical support	
	b. Course states accessible policies for student support, or provided link (tutorials, disability support) and is clear how to get support	
8. Course Accessibility and Usability		
	a. Course navigation is clear and easy to use	
	b. Course provides alternative means of access to course formats, (i.e., text describing images, script for videos or
