COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN NEVADA FINANCE & FACILITIES DIVISION MEMBERSHIPS, DUES, LICENSES & ASSOCIATION FEES POLICY

1. PURPOSE

To determine which memberships, dues and licenses may be paid for by the college and what types of funds can be used.

2. POLICY

- A. Descriptions:
 - Memberships There are two types of memberships, institutional and individual.
 Institutional memberships are held in the name of the institution (CSN). Individual memberships are held in the name of a person.
 - Dues Same as memberships.
 - Licenses and Associations Professional licenses are those required for a certain occupation such as CPA, architect, or medical license.
- B. Per **State Administrative Manual (SAM) 2628.0**, professional association dues (or memberships) for individual State employees are not allowed at State expense. State funds may be used to pay dues if:
 - 1) The State employee is eligible by virtue of the unique State position he holds;
 - 2) The membership is institutional;
 - 3) There are demonstrable benefits accruing to the State rather than the individual; or
 - 4) The professional organization is not open to all individuals of the profession such as the National Association of Accountants, the American Society for Public Administration, etc.
- C. No other individual memberships, licenses and association fees may be paid from state funds.
- D. Requests for payment of individual memberships covered under **SAM 2628.0** must be accompanied by documentation which substantiates the criteria. This is required for new memberships **and** renewals.
- E. A properly completed and approved payment document (PV, RX, LPO) must be submitted with the application or invoice.
- F. Commodity approval is required. Please reference the CSN Commodity Approval Policy.
