HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

The College of Southern Nevada cannot accept household hazardous waste for disposal. However, most local communities and/or counties have programs for collection of household hazardous waste. Typical wastes accepted (not all are listed here) include:

- Adhesives, coatings, and sealers
- Auto fluids and oil filters
- Cleaners and aerosols
- Concrete and driveway sealants
- Fluorescent bulbs
- Household batteries
- Paints and solvents
- Pesticides and fertilizers
- Photographic, pool, and lab chemicals
- Various electronics, computers, phones, etc.
- Varnishes, shellacs, and stains

Note: Clark County Residents must have photo ID and be either a direct residential customer (bring bill) or an indirect residential customer (live in a rental unit complex that contracts residential service).

Items typically not accepted for disposal at a household hazardous waste program may include:

- Asbestos
- Biological waste
- Medicines and prescriptions
- Ammunition and explosives
- Wastes generated from commercial businesses
- Unknown or unlabeled materials
- Electronics, appliances, and furniture
- Incandescent light bulbs
- Liquid mercury and mercury containing articles
- Tires
