




Fall Enrollment Headcount/FTE






FTE by Campus






Dual Credit 5-Year Enrollment Trend





IPEDS Completions – Students and Credentials








CSN Student Success Graduation or Transfer Aspen Rates by Report Year





IPEDS 150% Graduation Rates-Peer Comparisons





Left = Graduation Rate Right = Transfer-out Rate

Closing the Gap for Underrepresented Groups

African American Students:

Gateway Math and English completion increased from 7% to 16%

Pell Recipients:

Four-year graduation rate increased from 8% to 15%, and their Gateway Math completion increased from 23% to 39%

Hispanic Students:

Gateway Math and English completion increased from 15% to 26%





IPEDS Completions by Race/Ethnicity




IPEDS 150% Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity


Aspen Rates by Race and Ethnicity


